Dear Students:

In a continuous effort to improve American Pacific University, coming this May 24, 2007 a new program will be launched. The University will be opening the School for Transpersonal Psychology which will feature an online curriculum geared towards promoting a venue for the studies of transpersonal psychology. The School will initiate a graduate program to offer a Masters Degree in Transpersonal Psychology. This program aims to develop in students a knowledge base for working within the community and individuals through consulting, coaching, teaching or as a practitioner. Furthermore, it is designed to develop students' abilities in the demonstration of subject matter mastery in the area of integrative psychology.

In addition to this School, the University has opened a School for Esoterics and Hypnotherapy which will continue to provide support services to our currently enrolled students. Degrees offered by this School include: Bachelor in Clinical Hypnotherapy (BCH), Doctor of Clinical Hypnotherapy (DCH), Doctor of Esoteric Studies (DES), Doctor of Philosophy in Clinical Hypnotherapy (Ph. D.) and Doctor of Philosophy in Esoteric Studies (Ph.D.). This School will continue the University's goal of developing in students, innovative techniques and modalities in the fields of Clinical Hypnotherapy and Esoteric Studies.

With the establishment of these two institutions within the University, we are aiming to enhance and broaden the services available to our students and, in the future, seek accreditation for the Master's degree program. During our restructuring period, policy changes will occur with notifications disseminated by June 1<sup>st</sup> to our students with such policies to take effect by July 1<sup>st</sup> of 2007. The School for Esoterics and Hypnotherapy will discontinue enrollment of new students effective May 10, 2007. Students currently enrolled in the University will automatically be assigned to this School and continue to be supported by the University until the completion of their degree requirements as per the students' enrollment policy at the time of admission. The School will continue to offer a "teach out" program as long as it is necessary in support of our students.

In addition, the School of Transpersonal Psychology will be inviting a select number of the University's active students to enroll in the exciting new online program. If you are interested in finding out more about the innovative program offered and currently hold a Bachelor's Degree, we encourage you to inquire about enrolling in the Master's Degree program in Transpersonal Psychology.
